

# Correction

Additionally, the city of publication in Note 3 was incorrectly listed as "Oakland, CA". It is in fact Los Angeles. The corrected note is below.



**Figure 6:** Breakfast for Niños logo, 1970s. One of RCAF's most significant community programs was Breakfast for Niños, which was modelled on the Black Panther Party's Free Breakfast program in the nearby African American community of Oak Park. Established by RCAF members, including Irma Lerma Barbosa, Senon Valadez and Sam Rios, and under the leadership of Rosemary Rasul, the Breakfast for Niños collaborated with the Centro de Artistas Chicanos to secure much of the RCAF's programming funds.
